

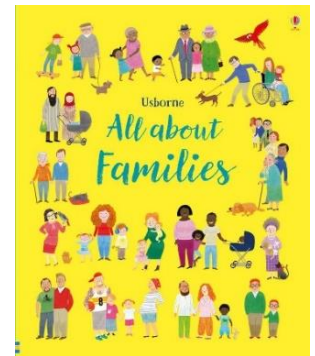
Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of your child's education at Oasis Academy Aspinal, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE is the curriculum subject that gives children the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

I am writing to let you know that this half term, starting 24<sup>th</sup> May your child's class will be taking part in lessons which will focus on the relationships and sex education (RSE) aspect of this programme.

Lessons in Year 4 will include pupils learning about:

- What is diversity?
- Do boys and girls have different roles?
- What changes happen to my body? (personal hygiene).



PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and it is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and senior leadership team.
