Animals

This half term our Topic has been 'Animals.' We have learning all bout different types of animals: pets, farm, jungle, nocturnal animals and animals that help others such as guide dogs. We have discussed our favourite animals, talked about animal homes and habitats and how to care for animals.

Parents Evening

It was lovely to have the chance to talk to you and share your childs progress at Parents Evening – there were some very proud parents looking through their childrens work.

Maths

We continue to work hard in our daily Maths sessions developing our oral / mental skills in particular – doubling, halving, addition and subtraction to 10.

Literacy

We have continued the animal theme in our Literacy sessions – we have focussed on Traditional Tales and animals in stories , such as The 3 Pigs, Little Red Hen . We have been developing our writing skills and are making some lovely progress.

Outdoor Area

We are very lucky that we have been able to secure some funding to upgrade our EYFS outdoor space. We have had some new equipment and more new equipment will be arriving shortly- the children are really excited by this. Can I please ask you to be mindful and respectful of this when you are collecting the children from the playground- we don't want to have any losses or damages.





English


In English we have studied a lovely book 'The Storm Whale'. We have been focusing on improving our sentence construction and punctuation though the use of adjectives, conjunctions such as 'and' plus the use of exclamation and question marks. We have planned and written our own fantastic stories based on 'The Storm Whale' titled 'The Storm Turtle'.

Maths

In Maths, we have been focussing on place value, partitioning numbers into tens and ones and comparing numbers. We have also been exploring length and weight, using the correct mathematical vocabulary and comparing length and weight using mathematical equipment such as rulers and balance scales.

Science

Our Science topic this half term has been 'Everyday Materials', We have named and described the properties of everyday materials, grouped and sorted materials and begun to understand why materials are chosen for specific objects.



History

As part of our 'Sustainable World' unit on Global Goal 12- Sustainable Consumption and production, in History we have been learning about fashion through the decades and the impact of fast fashion.

Geography

We have been introduced to the Global Goals and their aims and have explored the meaning of some of them. In particular, focusing on our Global Goal 12 and have tracked the production of a t-shirt to see the impact this production has on the World. We have considered our own behaviour and habits and planned and executed a 'changemaker' session (our toy swap shop) to help make a small change in our big world to encourage repurposing and reusing rather than always 'buying new'

As part of being school ready, we asked that all children ensure I-Pads have sufficient charge for the following day in school. We ask that parents/carers regularly check I-Pads to ensure not too many out of school apps are downloaded and that screens and cases are clean.

We are so incredibly proud of our superstars this half-term. We have seen fantastic engagement in learning sessions and super outcomes. Very well-done Year One.

What a brilliant half term we have had in Year 2!

Year 2 have grown in confidence with linking learning from earlier in the year and have gotten better at spotting the cross-curricular links in our learning. The Year 2 team have persevered and have worked hard to be the best versions of themselves this term.

In Maths we have investigated 2-D and 3-D shapes, lines of symmetry, reasoning and problem-solving questions. We developed our knowledge of edges, vertices and faces and used our key mathematical vocabulary to describe shapes.

in English we examined 'Halibut Jackson' by David Lucas and empathised and engaged with our protagonist. We explored themes and issues and sustained our ideas through discussion, drama and illustration and composed a free verse poem.


In Science pupils have enjoyed building on their Materials knowledge by investigating which materials are strong and waterproof and which materials would withstand strong wind.

In our History sessions we have explored Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and their significance and impact on hygiene, care and gender equality. Whilst in our Geography and Global Goals sessions we have looked at sustainable employment across the World and decent work, economic growth and investment.

It has been super term of learning, growing and absorbing information and embedding skills and knowledge. Thank you to all pupils and grown-ups for your continued support during a short, but busy term.




Throughout the half term, our big focus was all about 'Building a Sustainable World'. Our specific Global Goal was 'Life on Land' (GG15). We looked at deforestation and how this is impacting the world. We even had an opportunity to investigate the inspirational Sir David Attenborough and what a huge impact he is making to life on land! The pupils have created some amazing posters and a timeline, diving deep with researching and wanting to learn more!

This half term seems to have absolutely flown by! It was lovely to see so many of you at our second parents evening this half term supporting your children on their journey in Year 5.

We have welcomed a student teacher into our class this half term by the name of Mr Pierce, who we are very pleased to have with us until June.

This half term the children have completed their second assessments of the year and have really shown great progress-particularly in their effort with their times table recall! Why not ask them about their scores at home?

In class we have been working on Non-Fiction texts in our English unit and the children have expanded their knowledge of grammar. We have worked on phrases and clauses which is now following into our weekly homework tasks to make sure that the children remember this new knowledge and become confident using it.

In maths, many of the children have been challenged by our new multiplication methods. They have begun to learn short multiplication and short division methods. This is something which needs regular practice to continue embedding into the summer term and Year 6.

In PE this half term the children have been learning Orienteering with Miss Hardy and gymnastics with myself. Teamwork is something they have had to develop and explore. In Gymnastics we have also looked at counterbalancing which required lots of trust and communication.

Forces has been our theme in science this half term and we have been investigating gravity, friction, air resistance and water resistance! The children have learnt to develop their scientific skills by planning and carrying out investigations including making predictions and analysing their results.

10 minutes a day is all it takes to really give your child the best chances in life- just by reading with them! This half term we have tried our hardest to encourage them and are now offering children an extra playtime if they manage to read every night for 10 minutes! This can be a school book, accessing the Lexia app or reading something they choose or enjoy at home!

Have you heard about the EU's 17 Global Goals to aim to achieve by 20302 Why not ask your children about the Global Goal we have been learning about this half term. They have explored the importance of clean water and sanitation. We have looked into how we use water in our daily lives along with how sanitation has changed through history! We were horrified to learn that people used to share a public toilet and sometimes would even throw it out of their window into the streets!

After many conversations at parents evening about High School applications- if you would like any support or further information, then please do not hesitate to message or speak to myself.

I hope you enjoy the two week break and we look forward to welcoming all of the children back for their final term in Year 5 when we return!

PHILIP PULLMAN

This half term in English the children have produced some fantastic pieces of writing. We have written a setting description based on the book 'Clockwork or All Wound Up' by Phillip Pullman. We have also produced some amazing news reports on the current climate change crisis developed from our Global Goals lessons.

In maths, the children have been working incredibly hard! We have developed our skills in Algebra and have also been converting between measures including imperial and metric units.

Our theme this half term has been Our Sustainable World. The children have investigated the current climate change crisis. We have studied environmental activists Greta Thunberg who is known for challenging world leaders to take immediate action for climate change mitigation. We have also been working on creating a wind powered house in our design and technology lessons as part of an investigation into renewable energy.

In other areas of the curriculum, our science lessons have been based on electricity. The children began by studying basic circuits and then went on to explore how varying the components will result in different outcomes.
